


Fair Oaks Horticulture Center

Enter Fair Oaks Park on Temple Park Road (next to Fair Oaks Library). Turn left into the parking lot, go past the skateboard court, straight ahead to the Horticulture Center.

From Hwy 50 Exit north on Sunrise Boulevard; go 4 miles to Madison Avenue; turn right. Turn right onto Fair Oaks Boulevard.

From I-80 East Exit east on Madison Avenue; go 5-1/2 miles to Fair Oaks Boulevard; turn right.

From I-80 West Exit Douglas Boulevard, left at the light, right on Sunrise Boulevard, left on Madison Avenue, right onto Fair Oaks Boulevard.



Service dogs only are allowed in the Fair Oaks Horticulture Center.

Saturday February 18 9AM – NOON	Open Garden Learn about late winter and early spring vegetables. See herbs for cool seasons. <i>Demonstrations:</i> ♦ Prune: fruit trees, grapes, berries and ornamental grasses ♦ No-turn compost pile ♦ Mason bee houses
Saturday March 11 9AM – NOON	Open Garden <i>Demonstrations:</i> ♦ Grow warm season vegetables ♦ Fertilize fruit trees and citrus ♦ Manage pests in the orchard ♦ No-turn compost pile ♦ Thin early season grapevine growth and manage grape pests ♦ Prune herbs for better summer growth ♦ Learn how to select water-efficient landscape plants

Saturday May 13 9AM – NOON	Open Garden <i>Tour:</i> Irrigation methods throughout the FOHC <i>Demonstrations:</i> ♦ Grapevine thinning techniques to improve fruit quality ♦ Select water-efficient landscape plants ♦ Manage weeds, deadhead herbs
