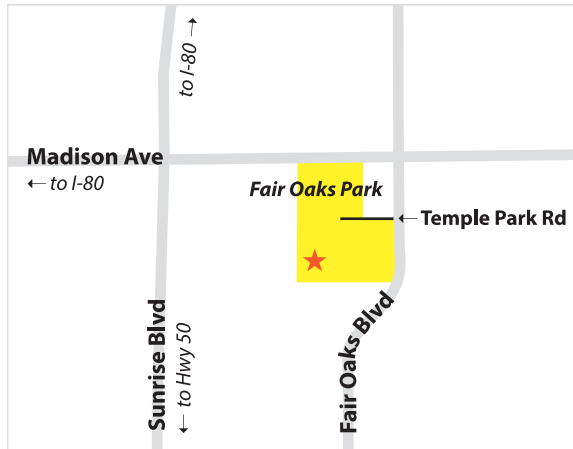


## Fair Oaks Horticulture Center

**Enter Fair Oaks Park** on Temple Park Road (next to Fair Oaks Library). Turn left into the parking lot, go past the skateboard court, straight ahead to the Horticulture Center.

**From Hwy 50** Exit north on Sunrise Boulevard; go 4 miles to Madison Avenue; turn right. Turn right onto Fair Oaks Boulevard.

**From I-80 East** Exit east on Madison Avenue; go 5-1/2 miles to Fair Oaks Boulevard; turn right.

**From I-80 West** Exit Douglas Boulevard, left at the light, right on Sunrise Boulevard, left on Madison Avenue, right onto Fair Oaks Boulevard.



Service dogs only are allowed in the Fair Oaks Horticulture Center.

- The water-efficient landscape garden areas are also open during Fair Oaks Park hours.

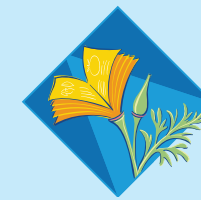
